We are thankful for over 4,000 GB girls in eighty schools stand distinct in their familiar blue uniforms and gleaming boots today. The story of the Girls' Brigade Singapore started 90 years ago in 1927. Mrs Elsie Lyne, a teacher at Methodist Girls' School, started the 1st Singapore Company to empower young girls to discover their potential as women of purpose. We remember with gratitude the legacy of Mrs Lyne and our pioneering leaders, who persevered and did not allow the disruptions of war and other challenges to deter them from pursuing this vision. We learn from them that it takes a clear vision and steadfast passion to see to the completion of seemingly impossible tasks.

In celebration of our 90th anniversary, we launched our new GB90 vision in April, which is to *Grow and Go Beyond - Extend. Serve. Lead.* Through new and exciting programmes, GB girls will be equipped to be T-shaped servant leaders who possess broad relational skills, as represented by the horizontal axis of the T, and deep technical skills, as represented by the vertical axis of the T.

The inaugural Walk-On-Water (WOW) Camp was held in June this year. GB girls were provided with challenging experiential learning opportunities that required them to step out of their comfort zones. Taking a "can-do" and adaptive attitude, GB girls can seek opportunities to overcome seemingly impossible situations and "wow" themselves!

GB launched our very own GB orchid named 'Papilionanda The Girls' Brigade Singapore'! This hybrid orchid is able to withstand harsh conditions and has roots that extend deep into the ground. The characteristics of this specially selected orchid will serve as a reminder of the character traits we aspire our girls to have - resilience during difficult moments and rootedness to serve our community.

I would like to especially thank School Leaders, Teachers and Officers for your support of the Girls' Brigade. Your support is essential as we nurture our GB girls to become young women who are able to make a difference, one person at a time, as they take on leadership opportunities in school and the community.

Honorary Secretary's Report 2017

The year 2017 has been an eventful year! We celebrated GB Singapore's 90th Anniversary and made our maiden attempt of achieving two Singapore Book of Records: "Most Number of People Sewing a Fabric Montage together" -1,455 girls and officers on 18 March at Methodist Girls' School, and "Largest Hand-Sewn Art Montage measuring 30m by 30m" on 12 August at GB Centre. With our new vision 'Grow & Go Beyond – Extend • Serve • Lead', the Brigade took pride in holding the Trooping of Colours marching together on parade. We also took the opportunity to name our very own orchid, the 'Papilionanda The Girls' Brigade Singapore' at our 90th Anniversary Celebration Dinner! We have been so blessed these 90 years, we seek to continue to grow in faith, and strength to impact lives in our communities.

We continue to praise God for our 3,637 girls and 676 officers and teachers/church volunteers in 82 schools. We have 40 Primary and 42 Secondary school companies.

1. HIGHLIGHTS OF 2017

1.1 Low Guat Tin Challenge and Singapore Book of Records

On 18 March, about 1,300 girls gathered at Methodist Girls' School (MGS) for the Low Guat Tin (LGT) Challenge 2017 – a national competition, where the objective is to remind GB girls that they represent the youthful SCENT in the community. Serving with Compassion, Empathy their "Neighbours" through Teamwork. The theme for LGT Challenge 2017 focuses on "Love Your Neighbour". Ms Joan Pereira, Member of Parliament, Tanjong Pagar GRC, graced the event as Guest-of-Honour. As the participants went through station activities, they challenged themselves to work together as a team. They also attempted Braille reading to raise awareness of the challenges of the visually handicapped.

It was heart-warming to see the bonding and teamwork among primary and secondary girls. A total of 92 Gold, 132 Silver and 18 Bronze was awarded to the elated teams! The Challenge Shield went to Team 7 of 1st Company from Methodist Girls' School. The best Heritage Board award went to 28th P (Kuo Chuan Presbyterian Primary School) of the Primary Section, and to 86th Company (Hougang Secondary School) of the Secondary section.

The event culminated with the bold attempt of The Girls' Brigade Singapore to garner 1,455 GB girls and officers for the Singapore Book of Record - "Most Number of People Sewing a Fabric Montage together". This provided a platform for past and present GB members to complete a task together. Their labour of love was the fabric montage, consisting of nine designs and 7,200 pieces of small squares with handwritten messages from fellow GB members. GBS has also entered into the Singapore Book of Records for the "Largest Hand-Sewn Art Montage" measuring 30m by 30m on 12 August 2017 at GB Centre!

1.2 Trooping of Colours and Awards Ceremony

On 8 April, we were honoured with the presence of Mr Ng Chee Meng, Minister for Education (Schools) and Second Minister for Transport, as our Guest-of-Honour at our Ceremony as we celebrated 90 years of our work amongst girls in Singapore. A total of 1,200 girls, officers, alumni and guests came together at Singapore Chinese Girls' School (SCGS) to celebrate this special occasion.

The GB90 logo and GB90 Vision for the Centenary was launched! GB grows and goes beyond to **Extend • Serve • Lead** – to extend our influence amongst girls, to serve communities and lead servant leaders to WOW (Walk-on-water) the World.

In celebration of the 90th Anniversary of The Girls' Brigade Singapore, we also trooped the Colours. Carried by officers, the National Colours, Brigade Colours and 56 Company Colours flew high and proud as they marched to the beat of the music provided by the 45th Company bagpipers and 3rd Company Alumni Fife Band. The Guard-of-Honour Contingent comprised 56 officers and 20 Warrant Officers from 11 Companies.

Awards were given out in recognition of the achievements of our GB companies in 2016. Besides the regular awards, some outstanding GB companies have achieved the Sustained Achievement Award for attaining five golds in seven years, and Sustained Gold Awards for attaining five, ten or 15 consecutive years of Gold Award. For detailed results, refer to Annex A.

Company Colours was presented to 66th Company in recognition of attaining the criteria of being a full-fledged Company. Awards were also given for Brigade Fortnight 2016, our annual fund-raising event.

1.3 GBS90 WOW Camp

An amazing four-day three-night camp for the girls at Walk-on-Water (WOW) Camp on 3 to 6 June 2017 was one of the highlights as The Girls' Brigade Singapore celebrates its 90th Anniversary. This was a first-ever national camp that brought together 296 primary and secondary girls from various schools in



Singapore and even Malaysia. The aim of this camp was to help give the girls a WOW experience. They learnt to **Extend • Serve • Lead**. A novel experience that was not only fun but thought-provoking as well. Through the activities, the girls were stretched beyond their comfort zone, grew in their character and changed their perspectives of how they perceived the world.

1.4 GB Friendship Day 2017

This year's GB Friendship Day (GFBD) was held in conjunction with the WOW Camp on 3 June. Themed 'Let Love Overflow', this is the annual outreach to serve the community as our girls, volunteers and alumni engaged the LENS (Lonely, Elderly, Needy and Special needs). Our GB girls and officers put up other activities, games, food and drinks stalls to engage the guests and serve through ushering and befriending.. This annual event was held at the tentage in front of Block 127 Toa Payoh Lorong 1. The Guest-of-Honour is Mr Gan Kim Yong, Minister for Health. Patron, Mrs Mary Tan, wife of former Singapore President Tony Tan Keng Yam, also graced the occasion. More than 1,000 GB girls, volunteers, grassroots leaders and community/corporate partners came to express their love and service to the invited special guests. It was a fun and fulfilling day for all who participated, LENS and volunteers!

1.5 Officers' Conference 2017

In celebration of our 90th Anniversary, we organised our first-ever three-day two-night Officers' Conference at Village Hotel Changi on 1 - 3 September. The new tagline for this year is *Grow & Go Beyond – Extend • Serve • Lead.* We had the privilege to hear from various keynote and plenary speakers. There was the regular workshop segment where participants get to learn something new for themselves or to take back to their respective companies for badgework: Kapap (self-defence), Decoupage, Leather-crafting and Tin Whistle. A major highlight of the Conference was the Learning Journeys to various parts of Singapore that calls for a fresh understanding of the Singapore society and issues that she faces so that we could best position ourselves to serve the community at large. To make this year's conference even more special, we had participants from GB Asia Fellowship – Cambodia, Hong Kong, Philippines and Thailand. Even the International President of The Girls' Brigade, Ms Vivienne Aitchison, stayed on after the International President's Committee meetings to join us for the three days.

1.6 90th Anni<u>versary Celebration Dinner</u>



The Girls' Brigade Singapore Anniversary Celebration Dinner was held at Shangri-La Hotel Island Ballroom on 3 September 2017. It was certainly a wonderful time for all 990 Girls' Brigade members, Alumni and friends as we celebrated GB, where memories of food, fun, abundance and fellowship abound. Our Guest of Honour was the Minister for Foreign Affairs, Dr Vivian Balakrishnan. Mrs Joy Balakrishnan also graced the occasion. Celebrating with us were

representatives from the Ministry of Education, Heads of Uniformed Groups, Church and School Leaders, our Past GB Presidents, Brigade Chaplains and our partners in the ministry. We were especially honoured to have with us the leaders of The Girls' Brigade International, and leaders and representatives from GB Asia Fellowship.

The highlights of the Celebration were the naming of the GB orchid – Papilionanda The Girls' Brigade Singapore and the launch of our GB Aspirational Values through a meaningful and beautiful sand art presentation by Ms Tan Sock Fong. God's amazing grace led 11 harpists (from ages 13 to 78) to perform together after only six lessons on the harp! Our GB girls also did us proud through their tin whistle performance. Members from the 53rd, 71st and 72nd performed three hymns.

There was a gift of a book for everyone. 'Rainbows in the Rain', a GBS 90 Anniversary Publication, is a legacy from the late Captain of 45th Singapore Company, Ms Sally Wong. Girls, whose lives Sally had impacted, worked tirelessly together with their Chaplain, Dr Sandra Tan and Sally's family, to put together a book, a tribute to their beloved mentor and friend. Dr Low Guat Tin wrote and connected the stories to bring forth a publication that is a compelling read.

GBS honoured two ladies for their sterling work in GB both in Singapore and internationally. Mrs Tay Poh Luan and Ms Hee Piang Chin received the Distinguished Service Award.

1.7 <u>Volunteers' Appreciation Lunch & Thanksgiving Service</u>

The Girls' Brigade Singapore, climaxed the 90th Anniversary with a tribute to Volunteer Officers, Helpers and Chaplains, at lunch cum Thanksgiving Service for 200 people on 4 November. GBS also expressed our appreciation to our Patron of six years, Mrs Mary Tan, wife of former Singapore President Tony Tan Keng Yam. A video compiling of all GB Friendship Day events was presented to her.

2. INTERNATIONAL PARTICIPATION

2.1 Girls' Brigade International Council

GB Singapore hosted the annual International President's Committee meeting at our GB Centre on 28 August – 1 September. Mrs Tay Poh Imm, being the International Vice-President (IVP) of Asia Fellowship, also attended the meeting together with the other four IVPs, Mrs Priscilla Penny (Africa), Mrs Hazelann Boreland and Ms Quindell Ferguson (Caribbean-Americas), Dr Claire Rush (Europe) and Mrs Renelle Neale (Pacific), chaired by Ms Vivienne Aitchison, the International President.

2.2 GB Asia Fellowship

GB Singapore also hosted the GB Asia Fellowship (GBAF) meeting held on 4 - 5 September, following the GB Singapore Officers' Conference. This year, the theme was 'Grasp the Vision, Live the Mission: Be Empowered'. The GBAF representatives were from GB Brunei, Hong Kong, Malaysia, the Philippines and Singapore, and observers from GB Cambodia. The Singapore delegation was represented by Mrs Evangeline Chong (Brigade Commissioner), Mrs Caryn Ong (Deputy Brigade Commissioner) and Ms Iris Lee (Assistant Honorary Secretary), together with IVP Mrs Tay Poh Imm (GBS President) and GBAF Advisors, Mrs Sally Chew and Ms Hee Piang Chin. It was a blessed time and bonding among the GBAF members.

The objectives of GBAF are:

Fellowship among member countries

Equipping of Leaders from member countries

Encourage member countries through keeping members informed of burdens and blessings

Teaming together to pursue opportunities for extension of GB mission and ministry

GBAF aims to be the **FEET** of GB International teaming together for the extension of GB Mission and Ministry. Our programmes aim to impact the girls and the community.

2.3 GB in Asia

GBS continues its community development efforts and outreach in partnership with churches in their missions' efforts to work amongst the women and children in several countries in Asia. We adapt the GB programme framework to be relevant and focus on literacy and lifeskills for girls and women in Asia.

3. NATIONAL EVENTS

3.1 Chaplains' Tea

The Chaplains Tea held on 24 March, was attended by 50 Chaplains/Captains, Executive members and staff of the Boys' and Girls' Brigade to foster good relationships among chaplains and captains to facilitate sharing and networking within the companies. The sessions included 'A Biblical Testimony' by guest speaker Dr Cheah Fung Fong from TRAC Children's Ministry, 'Does it make a difference' by Mr Poh Leong Berg, BB President and 'Going Beyond 90', by Mrs Sally Chew, GB President.

3.2 Fast Food & Fuzz Camps

Fast Food & Fuzz (FF&F) Camp was first introduced in 2006 with the purpose of teaching girls to give thanks and to appreciate what they have. This year's FF&F Camps were held on 1 - 2 July, 5 - 6 August and 12 -13 August. A total of 271 girls from 32 primary companies attended the two-day one-night camp away from the usual fuss from their parents and domestic helpers, and eating simple meals, such as porridge with preserved vegetables and braised peanuts. They experienced, through simulations, the conditions children from third world countries face daily. Girls were taught to appreciate and not take for granted the things they have, giving thanks in all circumstances and praying for people in need.

3.3 Promotion & Dedication Service

The annual Promotion Service was held on 8 July at GB Centre. Congratulations to 14 Staff Sergeants for receiving their Pioneer Brigader Brooches (Annex B)! A total of 25 officers also received their long-service awards at this service.

3.4 **GB Day**

GB Day was held on 17 July. GB members turned up in GB uniform in the various schools to commemorate the day. The message from our Brigade President, Mrs Sally Chew, was read out during the school assembly.

3.5 Brigade Fortnight

Brigade Fortnight, an annual fund-raising project, was held from 16 to 30 July, with GB girls and officers soliciting donations from friends, family, well-wishers and supporters. We are very thankful to all who donated and contributed to the collection of S\$637,514 to support the work of GBS. We would like to thank the donors for the generous support. In big and small ways, GB will continue to link hearts and hands with individuals and families to serve the communities.

3.6 National Day Parade

The theme of this year's National Day Parade (NDP), '#OneNationTogether', is a call to take pride in Singapore's achievements and to be confident as a people to overcome all odds together. The emphasis is on the importance of unity in times of uncertainty and challenges. Inspired by the nation's first Orchid series \$10 note, the '#' serves as a symbol of unity and home, and strength in social unity and multicultural harmony. This year's parade returned to The Float @ Marina Bay Floating Platform. A total of 43 girls from 1st, 2ndS, 4thS, 5th, 6th, 10th, 13th, 18th, 19th, 28thS, 31st, 34th, 40th, 42nd, 44th, 46th, 47th, 48th, 50th, 55th, 56th, 61st, 65th, 70th, 71st, 79th, 85th and 86th Company participated in this memorable parade.

3.7 Remembrance Day

Remembrance Day is held annually worldwide to honour those who had fought during the World Wars. On 12 November this year, members of the SAF Veterans' League, the Ex-Services Association of Singapore, Uniformed Groups and the public paid homage to those who sacrificed themselves during the World Wars. A total of 14 girls from 40th and 62nd Company attended the ceremony at the Kranji War Memorial in remembrance of the war heroes.

4. TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT

The GB Programme focuses on developing the leadership potential of the girls in alignment with the fourfold objectives of The Girls' Brigade – Spiritual, Physical, Educational and Social, and the vision of making *'Every Girl a Leader'*. The programme is wholesome, with emphasis on the four F's – Fun, Friendship, Fellowship and Fullness.

5.4 <u>Junior Brigader Brooch (JBB)</u>

The Junior Brigader Brooch, the highest award for a Junior girl who has successfully completed the Junior Programme, was introduced in 2015. The girl would have undergone training that equipped her with relevant knowledge and skills to lead confidently. The training aims to inculcate in her the values of reverence, respect and a sense of responsibility. She would have made significant contributions to her GB Company, demonstrated good leadership abilities and has been a good role model for other members and at home. A total of 42 girls received the Junior Brigader Brooch in 2017 (Annex C). The Awards were given out during the Junior Leadership Training Camp in March.

5.5 Pioneer Brigader Brooch (PBB)

This year, the PBB Selection Camp was organised in conjunction with the 90th Anniversary WOW Camp 2017. Prior to the selection, girls have to obtain at least 75% in the Brigade Knowledge Test in March before they qualify to attend the Selection Camp. A total of 39 girls from 1stS, 3rd, 4th S, 5th, 13th, 28thS, 34th, 42nd, 45th, 48th, 71st, and 84th Company attended the PBB Selection Camp. Throughout the camp, the girls were assessed on their conduct and leadership skills. Upon final overall assessment, 14 girls were awarded the Pioneer Brigader Brooch for 2016 (Annex B).

5.6 National Youth Achievement Award (NYAA)

A total of 58 girls from 18th, 31st, 46th, 47th, 50th, 65th and 84th Company received the NYAA Silver Award, and 65 girls from 10th, 28thS, 46th, 47th, 54th, 55th, 71st, 84th and 86th Company received the Bronze Award..
