One example is the incorporation of the Alexa digital assistant into a prototype, to tap on artificial intelligence in reminding the elderly to take their medication on time.

Let us continue to grow strong and work tirelessly to make an impact in our communities. We must extend the process of developing servant leaders by constantly nurturing and investing in our young, to bring up a fruitful generation. Our future-ready girls will then be equipped and empowered to take their place, to impact Singapore and then the whole world, a step at a time.

I would like to thank School Leaders, Teachers and Officers for your support of the Girls' Brigade. We deeply value the support you have provided and we treasure the strong partnership that we have with you. Together, we will continue to provide our girls with the experiences that will help them become active and concerned citizens who will play a constructive role in society.

## **Honorary Secretary's Report**

We continue to praise God for our 3,369 girls and 633 officers and teachers/church volunteers in 75 schools. We have 38 Primary and 37 Secondary school companies.

### **1. HIGHLIGHTS OF 2018**

#### **1.1 Inauguration Ceremony of GB Patron**

On 27 January 2018, we were honoured with the presence of Singapore President Mdm Halimah Yacob at the GB Centre as she became our GB Patron. Our girls and officers had a chance to interact with her and President Mdm Halimah Yacob visited our volunteers who were down for an Introduction and Induction Programme.

#### **1.2 National Drill Competition**

On 17 March, 67 teams from 62 companies participated in the National Drill Competition held at the Ngee Soon Camp. The Junior girls competed in the Creative Drill segment and 43<sup>rd</sup> Company from Henry Park Primary came in tops and was awarded the Challenge Shield. The Secondary girls competed in Impromptu Drill and 3<sup>rd</sup> Company from Fairfield Methodist School (Secondary) received the Challenge Shield in this category. SGT Jan Lim Yi Xiao from the 54<sup>th</sup> Company, Kent Ridge Secondary School was named The Best Commander for the 2018 National Drill Competition. (Detailed results are found in Annex A)

#### **1.3 Council Dedication and Awards Ceremony**

On 14 April, we had the dedication of the Council 2018 – 2020 and Awards Ceremony at Xinmin Secondary School. We had the honour of having Mr Sng Chern Wei, Deputy Director-General of Education (Curriculum) as Guest-of-Honour.

Awards were given out to recognise the achievements of various GB companies in 2017. For detailed results, refer to [Annex A](#).

Company Colours was presented to 88<sup>th</sup> Company, Pioneer Primary School in recognition of attaining the full-fledged Company status. Awards were also given for Brigade Fortnight 2017, our annual fund-raising event.

Two Service Awards were given out: Mrs Sally Chew received her 35-year Service Award as a GB Officer (citation in Annex D) and Ms Hee Piang Chin received her 50-year Service Award (citation in Annex E). We thank God for their love and faithful service in the work of the Girls' Brigade.

#### **1.4 GB Friendship Day 2018**

The intent of the annual flagship event, The GB Friendship Day (GBFD) was to help girls experience and see life and daily living through the lenses of the LENS (Lonely, Elderly, Needy, Special Needs) served.

The skills designed for the girls was to provide a national baseline for GBS girls to develop practical and servant leadership skills of listening, compassion, empathy to better engage LENS.

We held our annual flagship community service event, the GB Friendship Day (GBFD), on 14 July 2018 at the PA Headquarters. Our GB Patron, The President of Singapore Mdm Halimah Yacob graced the event as the Guest-of-Honour.

#### **1.5 BBGB Thanksgiving Service**

The inaugural BBGB Thanksgiving Service was successfully held on 20 October 2018 at Christalite Methodist Chapel. More than 100 officers, teachers and helpers attended the momentous occasion. The Right Reverend Terry Kee, President of the National Council of Churches in Singapore and Bishop of The Lutheran Church in Singapore presided over the service.

The two Brigades also signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the Explorers' Programme that BB and GB started in the pre-schools.

## 2. INTERNATIONAL PARTICIPATION

### 2.1 GB Asia Fellowship

Brigade Commissioner Evangeline Chong, Asst Brigade Commissioner Chow Yuen Peng, Honorary Secretary Thio Lay Hoon and Iris Lee attended the GBAF meeting held from 26 – 29 May 2018 in Penang. Mrs Tay Poh Imm, International Vice President (Asia) chaired the meetings and Advisors from Singapore Ms Hee Piang Chin and Mrs Sally Chew were there to lend their support.

The objectives of GBAF are:

Fellowship among member countries

Equipping of Leaders from member countries

Encourage member countries through keeping members informed of burdens and blessings

Teaming together to pursue opportunities for extension of GB mission and ministry

GBAF aims to be the **FEET** of GB International teaming together for the extension of GB Mission and Ministry. Our programmes aim to impact the girls and the community.

### 2.2 International Conference of the Girls' Brigade

The Singapore contingent of 10 delegates (Evangeline Chong, Caryn Ong, Pearl Pang, Judy Loke, Chow Mei Yin, Gloria Yeo, Tay Ching Yee, Darlene John, Lee Hui Ting and Esther Mak) participated at the International Conference of the Girls' Brigade (ICGB) in Livingstone, Zambia from 21 – 28 July 2018. GB International celebrated 125 years of fruitful and overflowing ministry. The theme song Celebrate Our Girls' Brigade Forever was composed by S/SGT Michelle Lau from the 1<sup>st</sup> Singapore Company. Ms Priscilla Penny was elected International President and Mrs Tay Poh Imm (from Singapore) was elected International Vice President Asia at the ICGB.

Ms Hee Piang Chin, International Vice Patron was invited to lead a workshop session and Mrs Sally Chew shared about a new entity GB Community Development Limited and its work and hopes to help GB International members achieve the Duke of York award.

## 3. NATIONAL EVENTS

### 3.1 Chaplains' Tea

BB GB Chaplains' Tea, held on 23 February 2018, was attended by 65 members comprising Chaplains, Captains, Executive members and Staff of the Boys' and Girls' Brigade. The event aimed to foster good relationships among Chaplains and Captains as this would facilitate sharing and networking amongst the companies. GB Associate Chaplain Rev Tan-Yeo Lay Suan led in the opening prayer. The speakers at the Tea session were Mrs Sally Chew GB President, Pastor Leon Steward from St Paul's Church, Rev Joe Heng from Adam Road Presbyterian Church and BB Exco personnel Mr Patrick Koh and Mr Wilson Tan. The event closed on a Q&A note assisted at the panel were Mr Poh Leong Berg BB President, Rev Daniel Tong, Mr Wilson Tan and Mrs Evangeline Chong.

### 3.2 Fast Food & Fuzz Camps

Fast Food & Fuzz (FF&F) Camp was first introduced in 2006 with the purpose of teaching girls to give thanks and to appreciate what they have. This year's FF&F Camps were held on 30 June – 1 July, 28 – 29 July and 4 – 5 August. A total of 244 girls from 32 primary companies attended the two-day one-night camp away from the usual fuss from their parents and domestic helpers, and eating simple meals, such as porridge with preserved vegetables and braised peanuts. They experienced, through simulations, the conditions children from third world countries face daily. Girls were taught to appreciate and not take for granted the things they have, giving thanks in all circumstances and praying for people in need.

**3.3 PBB & Officers' Service Award Presentation**

The annual PBB & Officers' Service Award Presentation was held on 7 July 2018 at GB Centre. Congratulations to 9 girls on receiving their Pioneer Brigader Brooches (Annex F). One of the recipients, was awarded the Endurance Award as well. A total of 33 officers also received their long-service awards at this service (Annex G).

**3.4 GB Day**

GB Day was held on 16 July 2018. GB members turned up in GB uniform at the various schools to commemorate the day. The message from our Brigade President, Mrs Tay Poh Imm, was read out during the school assemblies.

**3.5 Brigade Fortnight**

Brigade Fortnight, an annual fund-raising project, was held from 15 to 29 July 2018, with GB girls and officers soliciting donations from friends, family, well-wishers and supporters. We are very thankful to all who donated and contributed to the collection of S\$616k to support the work of GB Singapore. We would like to thank all donors for their generous support. In big and small ways, GB will continue to link hearts and hands with individuals and families to serve the communities.

**3.6 National Day Parade**

The theme for the National Day Parade (NDP) for 2018 was 'We are Singapore'. It was a call to celebrate our people, nation and home – a pledge of unity and togetherness despite our diverse culture. The parade was held at The Float @ Marina Bay. A total of 40 girls, 2 warrant officers and 3 officers from 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, 19<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>, 31<sup>st</sup>, 34<sup>th</sup>, 42<sup>nd</sup>, 46<sup>th</sup>, 54<sup>th</sup>, 55<sup>th</sup>, 56<sup>th</sup>, 65<sup>th</sup>, 70<sup>th</sup>, 71<sup>st</sup>, 79<sup>th</sup>, 85<sup>th</sup> and 86<sup>th</sup> company represented GBS at the parade. The contingent was led by Contingent Commander WO Tan Sheng Hui Diana (28<sup>th</sup> Company) and Reserve Contingent Commander WO Toh Yee Ling (47<sup>th</sup> Company).

**3.7 Remembrance Day**

Remembrance Day is a memorial day observed in Commonwealth member states to honour those who died during the World Wars. On 11 November 2018, members of the Singapore Armed Forces Veterans' League, the Ex-Services Association of Singapore, uniformed groups and the public paid homage to those who sacrificed themselves during the World Wars. A total of 15 girls from the 62<sup>nd</sup> Company attended the ceremony at the Kranji War Memorial in remembrance of the war heroes.

**4. TRAINING AND DEVELOPMENT**

The GB Programme focuses on developing the leadership potential of GB girls in alignment with GB's four themes – Spiritual, Physical, Educational and Social. It also furthers GB's vision of making every girl a leader while emphasising on the four F's – Fun, Friends, Fellowship and Fullness.

#### 5.4 Junior Brigader Brooch

The Junior Brigader Brooch (JBB) was introduced in 2015 to recognise outstanding Junior girls who contributed significantly to their companies. The girl would have undergone training that equipped her with relevant knowledge and skills to lead confidently. The training aims to inculcate in her the values of reverence, respect and a sense of responsibility. She would have made significant contributions to her GB Company, demonstrated good leadership abilities and has been a good role model for other members and at home. A total of 43 girls received the Junior Brigader Brooch in 2018 (Annex H). The Awards were given out during the Junior Leadership Training Camp in March.

### 5.5 Pioneer Brigader Brooch

The Pioneer Brigader Brooch (PBB) Award is the highest national award a GB girl in Singapore can attain. The girls went through an intensive, yet indescribably fulfilling four-day camp where their conduct and leadership skills will be assessed. They also learnt valuable lessons, go through life-changing experiences and make lifelong memories. PBB girls serve at the Promotion & Dedication Service and volunteer their services at other national projects. They are exemplary role models for the younger girls. Prior to the selection, the PBB Brigade Knowledge Test was held in March. The girls have to obtain at least 75% to pass the Brigade Knowledge Test to qualify for the PBB Selection. This year, the PBB Selection Camp was held from 9 – 12 June. A total of 27 girls from 1<sup>st</sup>S, 5<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup>, 28<sup>th</sup>S, 34<sup>th</sup>, 42<sup>nd</sup>, 45<sup>th</sup>, 70<sup>th</sup>, 84<sup>th</sup> and 86<sup>th</sup> Company attended the PBB Selection Camp. Upon final overall assessment, nine girls were awarded the Pioneer Brigader Brooch for 2018 (Annex F).

### 5.6 GB Endurance Award

The GB Endurance Award was made to encourage girls who have prolonged periods of illness where a member may be in and out of hospital, has to undergo repeated surgery or face life greatly handicapped physically.

Shannon Heng Zhu Ning from the 34<sup>th</sup> company at St Hilda's Secondary School had been diagnosed with SPASTIC DIPLEGIA, a form of cerebral palsy that is a chronic neuromuscular condition of hypertonia and spasticity from young. Shannon uses a walking aid to facilitate her movement and is excused from all physical activities in school. Shannon has been an active member of the Girls' Brigade Singapore since her primary school days (15<sup>th</sup> company in Tao Nan Primary School). She participated in the Pioneer Brigader Brooch Selection Camp and though exempted from physical activities had a very positive attitude towards being involved and volunteers to help in other areas so that she could be part of the activities.

Her perseverance and determination to do well and not be left out and willingness to take on what she could is exemplary and deserving of the Endurance Award.

### 5.7 National Youth Achievement Award (NYAA)

The National Youth Achievement Award (NYAA) Youth Leadership Development Programme is a self-development programme for young people between the ages of 13 and 30 years old. It is a holistic, balanced and non-competitive programme of voluntary leisure time activities, designed to provide young people with a platform to develop personal qualities and skills to make a difference to themselves, their communities and the world. The NYAA Bronze Award requires youths to be involved in the programme for at least six months. A total of 18 girls from the 26<sup>th</sup> and 47<sup>th</sup> Companies received the NYAA Bronze Award in 2018. (Annex I)
